I then was off to the home of Calgary's NHL Hockey Team, the *Calgary Flames*..

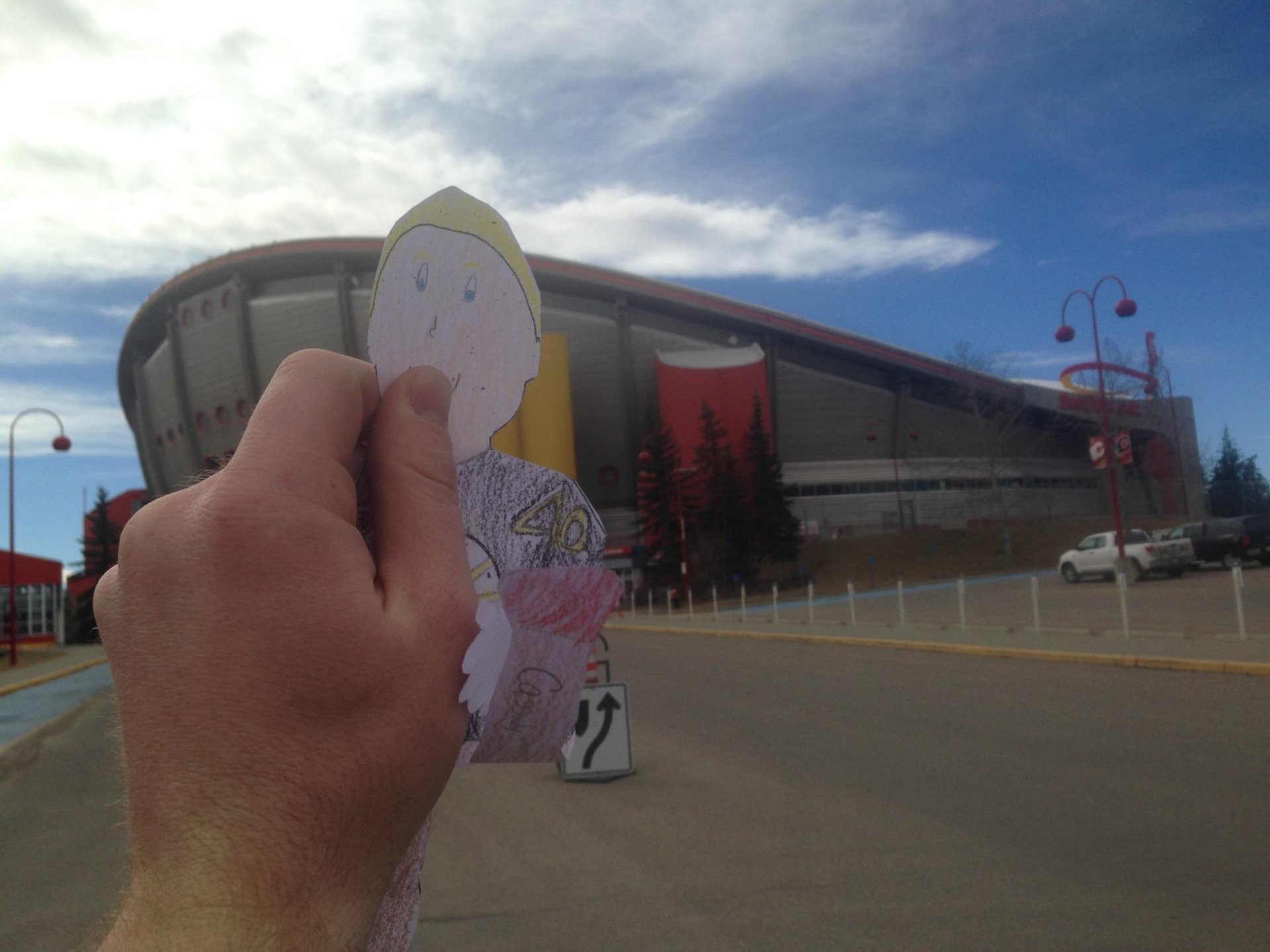


Calgary is very loyal to its team and the sport of hockey
